

# Skynet Junior Scholars Commitment Form

Funded by the National Science Foundation, Skynet Junior Scholars is designed to engage youth in the study of the Universe using the same tools as professionals. In SJS, young people get to be astronomers, controlling world-class telescopes around the world to take images of celestial objects from near-by planets to distant galaxies. Youth who become Skynet Junior Scholars will learn valuable skills in problem-solving, math and communication as they complete Explorations.

Youth in your programs may participate in SJS after adult leaders complete an SJS professional development workshop. The workshops are designed for informal educators and youth leaders who hold out-of-school-time programs for middle school and high school youth. The professional development workshop will provide practice in operating world-class telescopes, build confidence in leading astronomy activities, and supply the tools to guide your youth through an exploration of the Universe. Each participant will receive a free toolkit of materials for hands-on astronomy activities. To participate in a Skynet Junior Scholars workshop, you must lead a U.S. based out-of-school time program, work or volunteer for a U.S. informal education facility or be a leader of a youth group or club in the U.S.

## To be completed by SJS applicant

### SJS expects you to:

- 1) participate fully in the online or face-to-face workshop which should require about 20 hours over the course of the workshop.
- 2) commit to engage 5-10 youth in SJS Explorations by Mar 1, 2016. This will include:
  - Obtaining permissions from parents and/or guardians for youth to participate in SJS.
  - Hosting face-to-face sessions with youth to share and discuss SJS activities;
  - Leading hands-on activities in a group setting with youth;
- 3) To provide SJS evaluators and researchers with feedback and respond to evaluation and research surveys.
